**Notes from the Pastor**

This past Wednesday morning at Mass with St. Mary's Grade School, we had a "Silver Rose" present. In 1960 a movement was started by the Knights of Columbus Squires program (high school age young men who aspire to join the Knights when they are past 18) from Mexico, the United States and Canada, to pray for the sanctity of all human life from conception through natural death. It was decided to call upon the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas to assist in this mission. Originally a single live potted rose was relayed from council to council starting in London, Ontario, Canada in March and ending in Mexico City at the Shrine of O. L. of G. on Dec. 12, her feast day. The program went so well they decided they would like to continue it. A bronze rose was commissioned for the next year, then a silver rose the following year as more councils wanted to participate. Over the years the number of silver roses being relayed has risen to six. At each relay point the K of C council is encouraged to have some form of prayer service or have the rose present at a Mass before it is passed on to the next council. These roses have become a wonderful unifying symbol to continue praying for the respect for all human life and to continue to ask our Blessed Mother to intercede for us. Let us all pray for the sanctity, dignity and respect for all human life often.

### A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP WEISENBURGER

My dear brothers & sisters, you have already responded with exceptional generosity for the local victims of the hail storm in WaKeeney, as well as the terrible devastation that followed from Hurricane Harvey in Texas.
