**Notes from the Pastor**

Last March we contracted with a company to re-caulk the stained glass windows of the church because a couple of them were leaking when it was windy & rainy. They did a fine job and there have been no leaks since. I then started visiting with the Pastoral and Finance Councils, as well as the Building & Grounds and Liturgy Commissions about the possibility of repainting the inside of the church. These conversations led to questions about upgraded lighting, sound system, bathrooms, and expanding the gathering space. I decided to create a steering committee with representatives from these different entities as well as a few other people from the parish at large. Through this steering committee it was decided we should hire an architectural firm to help us with the planning of a major renovation project. I visited with the Diocese and received their approval to proceed. We sought portfolios from a dozen firms, narrowed it down to five for interviews, and then selected two that we asked to work together in helping us on this project. SFS (a firm out of Kansas City, MO) and Bieberly Architects here in Salina have agreed to assist us in our planning and the eventual implementation of a renovation project. Sometime in the near future we will start having parish interviews with various groups and the parish at large to determine needs and desires. I wanted to take this opportunity to inform you so you might start formulating your own thoughts as to what you might like to see. The architects will take all the information they gather and assist us in formulating a design and plans to move forward in phases.
