Notes from the Pastor

This weekend we take up the collection for seminarian support. This coincides with National Vocations Awareness week, a time in which we encourage people to pray for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life. In keeping with this, we are starting a program encouraged by Vocatio, our vocations support group here in Salina, called "The Traveling Chalice". Each weekend we want to send the chalice home with a different individual or family and during that week we would ask them to set the chalice in a prominent location in their house, and then each day of that week make a special effort to pray for vocations. If there are children in the family we would encourage the parents to visit with their children about the seminary, convent, priesthood and/or religious life. They might even ask their children if they have ever thought of a vocation to the priesthood or religious life, and what they think that kind of life might entail. We would ask that they return the chalice to the parish office on Friday of that week so it can be sent out with another individual or family the following week. There is a sign-up sheet in the gathering space of the church so individuals or families can sign up for specific weekends to take the Chalice home with them. Thank you in advance for supporting vocations.
