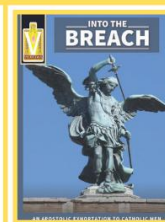

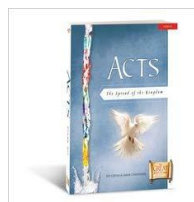


## SOLDIERS OF CHRIST

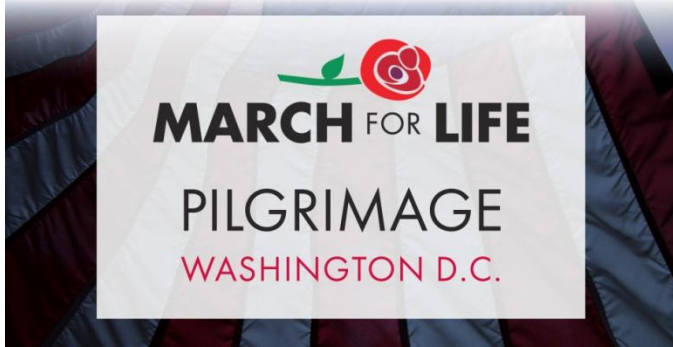
